The benefit of receiving palliative care at home looks different for every individual and their loved ones. It could mean a young family get to spend more time relaxing at home together instead of travelling to and from hospital. It can help carers and family members be more involved in and informed about a client's care, and importantly, it can significantly improve a person's quality of life.

I recently had the opportunity to speak with one of our PhD students, Norah Elvidge, about the translational impact her work will have on palliative care for our clients. Norah is a palliative care nurse who is undertaking her donor funded PhD at Queensland University of Technology and Silverchain.

Brenda's late husband Stephen Matthews OAM received exceptional care through RDNS Silverchain's palliative care service in Adelaide last year. When Stephen died, Brenda wanted to do something to show her thanks for the care that they both received.

"At first I had no idea what I wanted to do and how I could say thank you to all of the nurses who came into our home. I think a lot of them didn't realise the impact they made. They'd come in each day and talk, make us laugh, and take our minds off things. They gave every day a focus and their visits became the highlight of our day.

"I am truly appreciative of what they did for us. The nurses were there for me when I needed to cry as they weren't only there to nurse Stephen. They looked after me too, and there isn't a thank you big enough for that.

"I chose to say thank you with a donation because I wanted to thank them for what they did for me. I wanted to help make a real difference for others in the future, and to me that was meaningful." – Brenda

Innovation enhancing palliative care at home

The demand for palliative care is expected to rise by 50% between now and 2035, and double by 2050.1

This growing demand emphasises the need for greater investment in new models of care that enhance both patient and carer quality of life while reducing the burden on Australia's acute health system.

Thanks to your generous support, Silverchain is leading the way to provide better care options to more Australians.

Your support is helping our Research and Innovation team develop a new National Palliative Care Model of Care to create a gold standard in community palliative care that can be replicated across the country.

A key component of this new model of care is piloting a digital client and carer portal.

The portal aims to improve care outcomes, give clients more face to face time with clinicians, and address the diverse needs of clients and carers more effectively.

Using the portal, patients and carers can record symptoms, quality of life measures, plus, input various factors to improve care planning, and access relevant, targeted support resources and materials.

Key benefits of the portal include:

- A more personalised care experience for clients and carers: for example if a client inputs poor sleep, relevant help videos or other resources can be shared in response.
- Potential for early identification and intervention: where a client is beginning to deteriorate action can be taken sooner to keep a client at home and reduce hospital emergency presentations.
- Key health information can be stored in one place for clinicians to reference: reducing the need for clients and carers to repeat details of their symptoms and condition with each new care provider.

Dr Karen Smith OAM, Silverchain's National Director of Research & Evidence is leading the National Palliative Care Model of Care project and explains there are many benefits to the client and carer portal.

"When patient and carer information is accessible to clinicians and multidisciplinary teams in real time, we can expect enhanced patient management and improved care outcomes without additional consults. The benefits will apply to both the community and hospital settings and are likely to help reduce instances of carer burnout." Dr Smith said.

"I'm excited to see a pilot of the client and carer portal commence this year using insights gained in partnership with our clients to inform the new model of care."

Your support helps uncover important research discoveries to improve care

Your generous donations to Silverchain Foundation are funding an important PhD project to help Silverchain's Research and Innovation team build the new National Palliative Care Model of Care.

Norah Elvidge, Silverchain researcher, nurse and PhD candidate at Queensland University of Technology, is looking at a possible link between certain client symptoms or characteristics and increased hospital use by our specialist community palliative care clients. These insights will help us understand where more support is needed for clients to help keep their care at home.

Dr Smith explains how Norah's research will improve the National Palliative Care Model of Care.

"These findings can help inform how we'll tailor the client and carer portal. If we know which clients are likely to benefit from early intervention and additional support, we can build that into the portal to support better care experiences," Dr Smith said.

When Silverchain Social Worker Jacinta was visiting Dennis, she built rapport with Kate who revealed the reality of their financial struggles and the toll it was taking on them all.

As soon as Jacinta was aware of the situation, she made a Helping Hand application for a \$350 food voucher for Dennis to provide critical support for the family.
